

POLISH INSTITUTE SELECTS NEW EDITOR OF *THE POLISH REVIEW*

The Board of Directors of the Polish Institute of Arts & Sciences of America acting on the recommendation of a search committee, appointed Dr. Charles S. Kraszewski, the new editor-in-chief of its scholarly quarterly journal, *The Polish Review*. This multi-disciplinary journal published without interruption since 1956 is the only English language academic periodical devoted entirely to Polish and Polish American affairs. Dr. Kraszewski received his Ph.D. in Comparative Literature at Pennsylvania State University in 1990. He is currently Professor at King's College in Pennsylvania where he lectures on the literatures and cultures of Europe. He was twice recipient of Fulbright grants which enabled him to study at the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, and later to teach there as an adjunct professor in the Comparative Literature department of the Institute of Polish Philology. There he lectured on European Pre-romanticism and Translation Theory. His discussion with students in the latter course led to his book, "Translation Theory Backwards: Four Translation Strategies Determined by the Particular Needs of the Receptor". (1998). His published criticism chiefly centers on Polish, Czech and Slovak literatures.. The first issue of *The Polish Review* published under the editorship of Dr. Kraszewski is Volume LIII, 2008, no. 1 which appeared in late March.
